



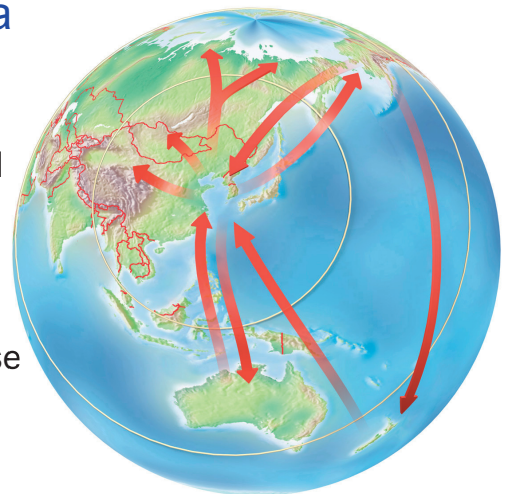
Invisible Connections
